### APESB issues restructured Code of Ethics

APESB issued the restructured *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including Independence Standards)* in November 2018. The revised standard incorporates amendments to the Code issued by the International Ethics Board for Accountants (IESBA) in

April 2018, with adaptions to suit the Australian environment.

#### Key revisions include:

- An enhanced conceptual framework that supports the fundamental principles of the Code in every section.
- Revised Safeguards with options to consider when looking at threats to compliance with the fundamental principles.
- A new definition for Inducements and clearer guidelines on appropriate behaviour in situations involving bribery and corruption.
- New and revised sections for Members in Business dealing with preparing and presenting information.

APESB Technical staff have developed a Mapping Table to assist Members in navigating the key revisions of the restructured Code to corresponding provisions in the extant Code.

IESBA Chairman, Dr Stavros Thomadakis' keynote speech was a highlight for the 70 guests at the dinner event, *An evening with IESBA Chairman, Dr Stavros Thomadakis,* on

8 November. Dr Thomadakis spoke about the five fundamental principles of the Code of Ethics and how the Code makes it clear that compliance with the fundamental principles is a primary duty of the professional accountant. Joining Dr Thomadakis were fellow IESBA member, Sylvie Soulier and Senior Technical Director, Ken Siong.

The second event was the joint APESB/IESBA information session on the restructured Code of Ethics, held at the CA ANZ offices in Sydney, the following day. The IESBA presented on the changes to the International restructured Code of Ethics, while the APESB focused on the relevant changes to the Australian Code and the new interactive PDF features.

Dr Thomadakis' keynote speech and the joint presentation on the Code of Ethics will be available on the APESB website soon.

# Proposed revisions to Insolvency Services Exposure Draft

APESB is seeking feedback on its proposed revisions to APES 330 *Insolvency Services*.

### Key revisions include:

- New requirements to clarify the responsibility of Members in Public Practice to determine the identity of parties involved in the Administration.
- Members in Public Practice must include all relevant relationships in the Declaration of Independence, Relevant Relationships and Indemnities (DRRI).
- New Inducements definition and new application material on the outsourcing of some or all components of the Insolvency Services provided.

Respondents can submit feedback on the Exposure Draft via the APESB website until 1 March 2019.

# APESB's submission to FASEA Legislative Instrument

In December 2018, the Financial Adviser Standards and Ethics Authority (FASEA) sought consultation on its draft Financial Planners and Advisers Code of Ethics 2018 Legislative Instrument. APESB acknowledges the redrafting of the FASEA Code now includes enhanced provisions on remuneration compared to the extant provision.

#### International News

In December, the IESBA announced the reappointment of Dr Stavros Thomadakis as the IESBA Chair for a further one-year term (2019).

Highlights from the IESBA Board meeting held 3 December 2018 in New York, USA, include the following:

- Approval of the Strategy and Work Plan (SWP).
- Technology and the potential impact on the relevance of the Code.
- Alignment of Part 4B of the Code with the revised ISAE 3000.
- The Role and Mindset of Professional Accountants project. <u>Skepticism</u>
